







Con was appointed to the Post office as a temporary postman in 1948, delivering the mail to Carriganima and Muinfliuch areas. which was a distance of about 20 miles per day. Between the years of 1948 to 1962, Con and his father, Eugene, worked as postmen and carried the unique distinction of being the first father and son to work for the post office together anywhere in Ireland. He replaced his father in 1962 and took over his father's existing route in addition to his own. In 1987, the postman delivering to the Ballinagree area retired and Con once again took on his position in addition to his two other routes. He covered a radius of 100km on a daily basis.49 years later, in 1997, Con the Postman took a well earned rest from delivering post. An Extraordinary Contribution to Macroom and its Hinterland

The town of Macroom and the Lee Valley area have been fortunate through the decades in having an excellent pictorial record of its people, places and events. The earliest photographs of the town form part of the Lawrence Collection. A more contemporary recording came with Paddy O'Keeffe, who through the 1930's and 40's both authored and pictured life in the town in his contributions to the Cork Examiner and Southern Star. Sadly, as is understood locally, all of his glass photographic plates were dumped in the clearing out of a house sometime in the 1990s. The next great contribution was, of course, that of Dennis Dinneen and the wonderful presentation of a collection of his photographs by Sean McSweeney in the outstanding publication entitled 'Muskerry through the Lens of Dennis Dinneen' that has captured the town, its people and environs for posterity. Through the years there have been different local correspondents who diligently compiled and recorded the happenings on a weekly basis and their reports provide an immense social history, especially within the Southern Star, Irish Examiner and the Lee Valley Outlook. Parish Bulletins also offer a particular contribution on a weekly basis.

Dan Joe Kelleher. Since the early 1980s, Dan

Kelleher has made an extraordinary contribution. He has video recorded a phenomenal range of events and has singlehandedly conserved the sounds, music, songs and laughter of an incredible number of events, not alone in Macroom and its hinterland, but further afield as the situation demanded. Dan Joe spawned LTV (Local Television) almost at the same time as RTE 2 came on air in the 1980s. He purchased a broadcast aerial from Cork and, with permission from his neighbour, William Riordan, erected it and a transmitter on a height of ground in Knockraheen. The amplifier had to be imported from California and this was done with assistance from one of the operatives at Cork Airport. He always transmitted from his own home and the transmission cable that had been buried and extended from his home, to the site at Knockraheen was phased with two aerials - the other he had erected at Sleaveen. A third aerial was placed on Clara to service the Millstreet area. Dan Joe explains that the maximum power used for transmission was a single Watt and his determination to succeed resulted in the registering of his local television project as a company, entitled LTV Services Ltd.,

There is no doubt Dan Joe was very far-seeing and very much ahead of his time in terms of recognising the importance, need and demand for Local Television Programmes. Speaking to him, it is clear that he was also very mindful of providing a community based service and that the programmes to be transmitted needed to be based on local occasions and events. He was very much aware of the requirement to make an application for a licence. He had a meeting with the Department of Communications in August 1984 and says that they appreciated his objectives in providing a local service that was strictly community based.

Consequently, no issue was raised in relation to the content as he was broadcasting his own copyrighted, original material. Dan Joe initially used VHS and then changed to UHF for broadcasting and in the 35 years of providing the service, he stresses that he never once received a complaint in relation to the broadcasting signal causing interference within the area.

Establishing Local Television was a major undertaking. It sparked the demand for house aerials and this placed an extra burden on Dan Joe, apart from all of the videos that were captured by him at the various events and subsequently broadcast on LTV. In order to receive the signal it was necessary that the aerial be as close to the television as possible. He instances one novel situation where an aerial was placed immediately outside a back door and the door was kept open in the belief that it might interrupt the signal.

Dan Joe has been highly progressive in keeping up with the latest and best in both recording and transmitting equipment. He started with a Betamax system; then moved to the VHS and Super VHS formats and tapes and, when the Digital S system emerged in 1992, he investigated and adopted it immediately.

He never recorded using the American NTSC but rather adopted the PAL format which is used throughout Europe. The amplifier for transmission was housed in a shed at the base of each of the three aerials that fed off each other. He is particular in pointing out that all of the broadcasting material originated from his personal recordings and subsequent editing. Watching Dan Joe indexing the voluminous recordings that he has committed to each of the various formats of tape is wondrous and his contribution to local communities and the record of the social events that are vivid on the tapes and nowadays converted into DVDs is extraordinary.

Dan Joe's amazing archive of DVDs enables one to re-wind time and look again at a host of events dating back across the past 35 years and including such examples as:- Local Concerts; Pantomimes: GAA Matches: Macroom at the Opera House; Macra na Feirme; commemorative events including 1916; Masses; School Openings; Anniversaries; Holy Wells; Famine; Corpus Christi; All-Ireland Scór; Bowling and an amazing collection of Guide Dogs Walks; NDC Milk Runs; Confirmation and Communion Days; Gougane Sunday; Car Rallying and the many interviews that were filmed both in Macroom and in the surrounding area. There is no doubting the importance of this incredible resource and, coupled with the outstanding LTV service that has been provided, it is important that individuals and groups should avail of the opportunity to obtain copies of the DVDs of their respective events . (026 44007).

Dan Joe Kelleher has been more than generous with his time and expertise and each and every community that benefitted from his recordings can be ever grateful for such a truly outstanding record and service that he delivered, largely on a voluntary basis to the public. He expresses a deep sense of appreciation to all who assisted in organising various events for videoing; to those who conducted a host of interviews; commentators at games and M.C.s, hosts or hostesses at house party occasions. An examination of the archive of DVDs that are currently available reveals the recording of at least 2,500 events.

County Football Leagues 2019

The 2019 county football leagues have commenced with new stricter rules to avoid postponements and stiffer penalties for teams not fulfilling their fixtures.

Completion Dates

With leagues to be completed before peak championship season in August, the completion date for the group stage of the 2019 leagues is Sunday, July 14th. League finals are scheduled for the last two weekends in July. Dates and times for all regular rounds have been fixed by the CCC

Referee

Where the appointed referee fails to attend, agreement must be reached between the two clubs on a substitute referee by either tossing or by agreement. Failure to comply will result in forfeiture of the league points by the club or clubs failing to agree.

Request for Postponement / Change

Any request for changes to the listed time and / or date must be sent from the club secretary's official email to the county secretary's official email administrator.cork@gaa.ie at least five days in advance of the fixture. No postponements shall be granted thereafter, except in exceptional circumstances.

If a match is to be postponed or changed the following criteria must be met:

Both clubs must email administrator.cork@gaa. ie separately, referencing the fixture involved, both outlining the same reason for change of fixture and both listing the same new agreed re-fixture date / time. The re-fixture date must be on / before the same date in the following month and on / before the July 14th deadline. If two clubs fail to agree on either postponement or a re-fixture date the fixture stands

Unfulfilled Fixtures / Walkovers

A fine of €100 per team will apply for each unfulfilled fixture, In addition, a club which fails to complete more than two of its fixtures in the group stage of a league during a calendar year will be automatically relegated. It is at the discretion of the CCC whether a team is promoted (or not relegated) in its place. If a club is disqualified or retires during the course of the league, its played games shall stand and its unplayed games awarded to the opposing teams. A fine of €100 per game will apply.

Substitutions

Up to nine (9) substitutions shall be permitted in the playing of normal time in all games in the County Leagues, County Junior Leagues 'A' and 'B' and other Secondary Competitions under the jurisdiction of Coiste Chontae Chorcaí. A maximum of three substitutes remains for extratime, where played.

League points

League results shall be credited as follows: 4 points for a win, 2 points for a draw and 1 point for each game played. Therefore, a winning team get 5 points for a particular match and the losing team gets 1 point. If a walkover is granted 5 points and 0 points are awarded, respectively (deviation from rule granted by Central Council).

Ballincollig, in Division One, were the only first round winners from Muskerry. Ballinora and Grenagh earned draws in Div 4, and Béal Átha'n Ghaorthaidh in One, Macroom and Aghabullogue in Two, Naomh Abán in Three, all suffered opening day defeats. 





KNOW YOUR RIGHTS: INCOME TAX BANDS AND RATES

QUESTION: I'm a PAYE worker. What income tax will I pay in 2019?

The amount of tax that you have to pay depends on your personal circumstances. Tax is charged as a percentage of your income. The percentage that you pay depends on your income.

The first part of your income, up to a certain amount, is taxed at 20%. This is known as the standard rate of tax and the amount that it applies to is known as the standard rate tax band.

If you have income above the standard rate tax band, it is taxed at the higher rate of tax, which is 40%. The amount that you can earn before you start to pay the higher rate of tax is known as your standard rate cut-off point.

For 2019, the standard rate of tax remains at 20%, but the standard rate tax bands have been increased as follows:

They are like trees planted along a riverbank with roots that reach deep into the water. Such trees are not bothered by the heat or worried by long months of drought. Their leaves stay green and they never stop producing fruit." (Jeremiah 17:7-8) Here we have a picture of people who have put their trust in God, and no matter what the circumstances going on around, they live peaceful and fruitful lives because they are connected to the Lord and He provides a constant flow of refreshment and life to them. Jesus gave us a similar picture in John's Gospel chapter 15 when He calls Himself the true Vine, says God our Father is the Vinedresser, and the people who trust in Jesus as Saviour are the branches of the vine. When we abide and stay attached to the Lord through His Word, we will bear fruit by reflecting the nature and character of God. Who is Love (1st John 4:16). But Jesus warned those who break off from the Vine - that is those who a) live self centred lives (living only for themselves) or b) live by self righteous acts (by trying to attain salvation only through good works) or c) live self-dominated lives (in total rebellion, not submitted to God) - are setting themselves up for disaster. They, like the branches broken off the vine, will be cast into the fire because they are not producing fruit.

Jesus then goes on to reveal His amazing sacrificial love for us. As we follow His lead and make a decision to love others our relationships will improve as our focus shifts from self, and we partner with Jesus our Best Friend to change the world. Jesus laid down His life for you and for me, and He expects us to do the same for others by loving them and not judging or criticising them. This is not an easy thing to do! But, as we study the Word of God we become transformed from the inside out, and if we are truly following Jesus we will obey His commandment to love one another. Talk is cheap many people claim to be Christians but - "out of the abundance of the heart, the mouth speaks" (Matthew 12:34; Luke 6:45). Check out what is coming out of your mouth friend — are you blessing or cursing others with it? Are you walking in Love?

ADVICE FOR PEDESTRIANS CYCLISTS MOTORCYCLISTS IN SNOW ICY CONDITIONS

Walking, cycling and biking in the wintertime can be hazardous but especially so in snow and icy conditions.

While it is advisable for cyclists and motorcyclists to consider cancelling a journey and taking alternative transport, in such conditions, pedestrians may not have that choice.

Many slips and falls on snow and ice happen in places people regard as safe and secure, typically outside their front door, on the door step, on the path or while getting out of the car or truck. DO NOT underestimate the dangers of snow and ice. Try to keep your driveway and / or path as clear of ice and snow as possible. Help an elderly neighbour to do this if you can.

Each winter slips and falls cause serious injuries. Even when surfaces do not look especially icy or slippery, it is very possible that a thin sheet of transparent ice or "Black Ice" is covering your pathway putting you at risk. When you approach a footpath or roadway that appears to be covered with ice or snow, always use extreme caution.

The most typical injuries caused by slips and falls on ice and snow are fractures and dislocations of the wrist, shoulder and ankle.

Winter pedestrian safety is especially important for older persons, who need to be extra cautious when walking, as a fall on the ice can cause them to break a hip, or other bones

Read on for tips on walking, cycling and biking safely in the snow and ice:

ADVICE FOR PEDESTRIANS

- · If a journey cannot be avoided walk on a footpath, not in the street. If there are no footpaths walk on the right hand side of the road (towards oncoming traffic).
- Be extremely careful as frost, ice and snow will make walking on footpaths very dangerous.
- Remember that footpaths may not be treated so walk with extreme care
- Make sure you are wearing appropriate footwear, wear shoes or boots with appropriate
- · Don't walk with your hands in your pockets, walk with your hands out and wear gloves so you can break your fall if you do slip.
- In extreme conditions consider an appropriate walking stick or walking pole.
- · Avoid walking in the streets at all costs if possible. Remember, cars and trucks slip and slide, too! If it's an emergency, and you can't avoid the street, wear bright or reflective clothing.
- Visibility is reduced in snowy or freezing fog conditions so wear high visibility clothing, an

armband, Sam Browne belt or a high visibility vest. Consider carrying a torch.

- Wear clothing that does not restrict your vision.
- Stay warm, but DO NOT impair your vision with hoodies, ski masks, scarves, hats, etc. This type of clothing could prevent you from spotting icy conditions that may lead to a fall or not enable you to see a car that is spinning out of control.
- Try to avoid carrying things while walking in the winter, as this can throw you off balance.
- · Avoid pushing young children in buggies / strollers if at all possible. If you must push your child in a buggy / stroller on the ice, take great care and walk extremely slowly.
- Snow and ice cause havoc quickly, so use extra caution when crossing roadways, and always cross at pedestrian crossings.
- Ice can easily hide under a light dusting of snow. Just because you don't see the ice doesn't mean it's not there waiting for your unsuspecting footfalls.
- If you can't avoid the ice and snow, bend your knees slightly and take slower, shorter steps to help reduce the chance of a slip and fall and an iniury.
- · If forced to use the steps at someone's home, apartment, or other public building, walk slow and take shorter steps when descending. The same is true of driveways and other hilly terrain; these areas can be very dangerous when they become slippery with ice or snow. Steps especially can be hard to clear and build up ice easily.
- · Be aware of overhead hazards! Falling icicles and chunks of snow pose a serious risk. In extreme cold weather icicles can build up in size very quickly and are lethal. Their size and dagger-like formation are extremely dangerous for pedestrians. Be aware of what's happening above you, and stay clear from the edges of buildings.
- · It's not a good idea to go jogging in snow or icy conditions

ADVISE **FOR** MOTORCYCLISTS **CYCLISTS**

- Motorcyclists / Cyclists should not compromise their safety by their 'need' to travel in icy/ snow conditions. Cancel your journey or take alternative transport.
- · Visibility is reduced in snowy condition so cyclists should wear a Sam Browne Bandoleer belt or high visibility vest and ensure the lights on your bike are working correctly.
- Cyclists should adhere to the requirement of a white light to the front and a red light to the rear.
- · Wear an approved helmet and consider clear

eye protection.

- · Motorcyclists should avoid wearing a dark visor in any bad light conditions.
- Remember other road users may not 'expect' you and could therefore comprise your safety.

ACCIDENT AT WORK

No matter what precautions are put in place, accidents at work can and do happen under varying circumstances. Injuries caused by these work accidents can range in severity from minor lacerations and sprains to broken bones, amputations, severe burns and sometimes sadly, even fatalities.

If you are unfortunate enough to be involved in an accident at work and you suffer from a workplace injury, you may be able to sue your employer for damages.

In Ireland, employers and business owners are legally responsible for the welfare and safety of their staff and any visitors to their premises. All businesses or employers should compulsorily hold insurance and comply with Health & Safety legislation and European workplace regulations.

You may have a valid basis to sue your employer for damages if you are injured at work for any of the below mentioned reasons and have suffered a personal injury:

- · Slip, trip or fall
- · Dangerous practices and procedures in the workplace
- · Defective or poorly maintained equipment
- · Dangerous machinery at work
- Falling object

- Non-adherence to Health & Safety
- Negligence of co-workers
- Insufficient or improper training
- Assault at work
- Accident while operating a forklift or crane
- Faulty lifting and manual handling practices brought on by lack of training
- Industrial injuries such as hand arm vibration syndrome or vibration white finger

You will be required to prove that your personal injury was caused as a consequence of the negligence of your employer. This is a two tier test in that you will have to prove your employer was liable for the accident and secondly, you will need to prove that your injuries are resulting from the workplace accident. It is very important you notify your employer of the accident as soon as possible, if not immediately after it occurred and you attend a doctor or hospital in order that they have a record of the injuries you have suffered.

The time limit to bring a case under the Statute of Limitation is two years from the date of the accident but an application will normally have to be brought first to the Personal Injuries Assessment Board (PIAB) and the clock will stop whilst they are dealing with it but will run again if the claim is no longer being dealt with by PIAB. It is advisable that you instruct a solicitor as soon as possible.


