

MACROOM UPDATES



Briery Gap Drama and Light Entertainment Festivals

For a third consecutive year, the All Ireland finals of the Schools' Light Entertainment and Drama Festivals were lost to Macroom due to the ongoing closure of the Briery Gap. The finals were held in Mullingar in 2017 and 2018 and the 123 year old Everyman Theatre in Cork was the iconic location for the 2019 event, staging a total of 26 productions from schools from all over Ireland. The main sponsors were Cork Education and Training Board, Cork County Council and Blarney/ Macroom Municipal District. Adjudicators: Geoff Gould (Theatre Director), Cathal McCabe RTE and Kelly Ann Healy (Musical Theatre/Drama).

Light Entertainment. Ten schools from Cork, Tipperary, Westmeath, Louth, Waterford and Mayo contested the Light Entertainment Festival. The Dónal Buckley Cup for Best Overall went to Gaelcoláiste Fionnchua, Mitchelstown, with an amazing staging of The Greatest Showman. Davis College, Mallow came 2nd overall and also won the Mary McSweeney Cup for Best Choral with a variety show that incorporated lovely traditional music and dance. Third were Wilson's Hospital School, Multyfarnham, with a serious, original

presentation dealing with racism. Sacred Heart Westport won the William Harrington Perpetual Cup for Best Traditional, incorporating Sean Nós and modern dance, wonderful lighting stage effects and costumes and a memorable Poc ar Buille St Brogan's Bandon won the award for Best Original Act.

Transition Year Drama. Seventeen groups contested the drama final and there were some memorable presentations, particularly the original shows. Schools represented Cork, Kerry, Waterford, Clare, Dublin, Longford, Donegal, Kildare, Mayo and Westmeath. Black water Community School, Lismore, were the outright winners, earning the Mullingar Perpetual Trophy as well as the Michael Twomey Cup for Best Producer/ Director and the Dermot Bradfield Cup for Best Set/Lighting for their polished staging of 'The Voice'. Second were Castlepollard College and joint 3rd were Royal and Prior Donegal with an excellent presentation of the Playboy of the Western World, winning Best Costumes, and a really impressive, original play, Terminal 2, written by the two main characters, Aoife Moran and Katie O'Connell . Dealing with teenage death from cancer and suicide, it was a striking and topical drama. Watch out for these budding playwrights. They won the award for Best Original Script. Best play in Irish went to Gaelcoláiste Ciarrai, Trá Lí. Mount Sackville won the Seamus and Máiréad Barry Cup for Best Non Previous Prize Winner.

Macroom Tidy Towns

Macroom Tidy Towns held the 2019 A.G.M. recently and there was a good attendance. The officers are Martin Coughlan (Chair), John Lyons (Sec), Judy O'Sullivan (Treasurer), Catherine Murphy (PRO). The Chairman thanked all involved, particularly the PRO, Catherine, for facebook contributions, and her role in the fairy garden with a group of dedicated volunteers. He thanked the Council for their financial support. He also thanked all the volunteers that helped on events such as St. Patrick's Day parade, Food Festival and erection of Christmas lights. He referred to the site planning application for a storage shed in Masseytown and thanked generous sponsors for their support. A proposal was made that a tree be planted in memory of the late Derry Coakley.

The Secretary gave a detailed report outlining the activities of the past year and some works planned for 2019. Saturday morning work by up to 20 volunteers is particularly effective. Work is slowly ongoing with the implementation of the 3 Year Plan. Macroom was awarded €700 and a silver medal for the 3rd time in the Tidy Towns and is now just 20 marks off the National winners in our category. Macroom also won the 2018 Litter Challenge. It was very colourful during the

summer. Volunteer Work carried out included Litter Picking, planting and caring for summer plants, painting of street furniture, railings and bollards, weeding and some street sweeping. The Fairy Garden has been the most significant single project undertaken by volunteers and is still a work in progress. Currently, plans are being drawn up for an adjacent sensory garden. Revenue is up from the recent Church Gate Collection. Further large capacity new bins were erected on the main street near Murphy's

corner. Tidy Towns Facebook page is updated very regularly and has generated widespread appreciation and awareness of the work of the

Main sponsorship comes from Blarney/Macroom Municipal District Council, with excellent support and co-operation from the Men's Shed, the Good Lives Project, TUS and RSS and more recently, IRD Duhallow. A lot of emphasis is placed on local amenities and the environment and engaging with businesses, residents groups and particularly schools. Members visited All Ireland winners, Listowel and learned from them. Huge emphasis is now on biodiversity and we planted 250 trees and 40 shrubs by the river and 99 climbing plants between the mart and NCT. A mural or Macroom Castle has been completed on Canty's wall and another is planned for the Town Park entrance. Work has commenced on developing a heritage brochure for Macroom.

Issues to be sorted out with the Council include the Mill Stream Project, derelict sites, seating, spotlights, outdoor gym equipment and tree pruning in Town Centre.


Ballincollig 1 - 16 Kilmurry 0 - 13

KNOW YOUR RIGHTS: SCHOOL TRANSPORT SCHEME

Question: My daughter is starting secondary school in September and we live 5 kilometres from her school. Am I eligible for the School Transport Scheme?

Answer: You may qualify for the School Transport Scheme. The scheme provides subsidised school transport for both post-primary and primary pupils. Bus Éireann runs the school bus service and the Department of Education and Skills decides the annual fares. The service is only provided where there are at least 10 eligible pupils in a distinct locality that can be economically serviced by a bus route. Even when a pupil meets the age and distance criteria for school transport, there is no legal entitlement to it.

Your daughter is eligible for the Post-Primary School Transport Scheme if she is attending her nearest school and lives 4.8 kilometres or more from the school. The Department and Bus Éireann determine the appropriate nearest school with regard to ethos and language.


Parents must arrange to bring their child to the nearest pick-up point on the bus route. Generally, bus routes are organised so that no pupil has more than 3.2 kilometres to travel to a pick-up point.

There is a single annual charge of€350 per pupil. However a family does not pay more than €650 per year. The charge is due to be paid in full by the end of July or else in 2 instalments: by the end of July and the start of December. Pupils who are eligible for school transport and who hold a valid medical card are entitled to free school transport to the nearest school.

Since your child is enrolling in post-primary school for the first time, you should either apply for school transport online or download the form from Bus Éireann's website. Applications are now being accepted for the 2019-2020 school year. You should apply by Friday, 26 April 2019.




