



On Tuesday 23rd May 2023, Emily Mehigan a member of Ardilaun guides and McEgan Senior Branch travelled to Dublin to attend a conference on the "European Child Guarantee: Experiences from across Europe". Emily represented the National Youth Assembly at the conference and addressed the delegates on the topic of Social Exclusion.

The European Child Guarantee aims to ensure that every child in Europe at risk of poverty or social exclusion has access to the most basic of rights like healthcare and education. Most Member States have developed National Action Plans, with Ireland's approved by Government last summer.

Speakers included Kevin McCarthy (Secretary

General, Department of Children, Equality, Disability, Integration and Youth), Jiri Svarc (Head of Unit, DG Employment, Social Affairs and Inclusion, European Commission), Lara Hynes (Assistant Secretary General (Child Policy), Department of Children, Equality, Disability, Integration and Youth), and Anna Visser (Head of Unit, Child Poverty and Wellbeing Programme Office, Department of

Emily and another member of the National Youth Assembly addressed the delegates and sat on a panel for their respective topics. Emily spoke on Social Exclusion and of the fact that not all children, individually or whole groups, have the same opportunities as others. For complex reasons they may not have the chance to have their voice heard or to access the same opportunities as their peers. She spoke of how she sees the impact of social exclusion and what could make the biggest difference in



tackling this problem. Emily also highlighted in her speech that she is a member of Irish Girl Guides, an organisation that promotes inclusion and allows all girls and young women to avail of fantastic opportunities.

U14 Hurling Team:





#### **COMPOSTING IN SCHOOLS**

Hi! Chris Barrett back with you again. Today I have the pleasure of speaking again with Donal O'Leary from Waste Down. Donal is an Environmental Trainer and member of the Composting Ireland team, and today he will share information with us regarding Composting in Schools. Composting can be a beneficial and educational activity for schools. Some schools require their pupils to take home all waste including fruit peels and cores and uneaten food, but all schools generate at least some amount of organic waste through the staff canteen, and perhaps the school's grounds or garden. Being able to compost this waste successfully within the school grounds can create both a valuable resource (compost) and a unique learning opportunity. Most schools that attempt composting, just like most households, use a standard plastic "cone" or "Dalek" style of compost bin. This type of bin works by opening the lid and placing the waste inside, and eventually harvesting finished compost by removing it via the hatch near the bottom of the bin. These bins need careful management to work well, and they are not very suited to a lot of wet, heavy waste such as tea bags and fruit waste - precisely the kind of materials generated in schools! Even with the best of intentions, it is hard for busy school staff to keep a compost bin from becoming a source of smells, flies, and disenchantment.

The Composting Ireland https:// team compostingireland.ie/ has designed a Composting in Schools programme to help schools to begin (or improve) their composting activities with expert guidance and ongoing support, as well as to bring greater elements of biodiversity, gardening and soil science into their daily lessons.

These are skills and values that will be vital for restoring and maintaining soil health and local ecological systems, and of course for growing



food locally and organically. Food security is a huge elephant in the room for an island nation in a time of climate change and global political and economic instability.

The Composting in Schools programme was launched in 2021 with almost 100 schools taking part in the Dublin area, and it now being rolled out in several other counties. In Cork, the programme will be run on a pilot basis with 10 schools with funding provided by Cork County Council's Environmental Awareness office. The programme has compiled a large range of online resources which are made available to participating schools. Training consists of five training sessions for school staff which cover:

- Why composting is so important,
- Biology and essentials of composting,
- Managing and reducing garden and landscaping
- · Composting of fruit waste, tea bags etc.,
- Setting up a wormery,
- · Creating an action plan for school composting, garden, and biodiversity,
- · How to use compost to improve soil health and plant growth.

Further support includes site visits to each school by a composting expert, and assistance in acquiring the equipment needed by each school. You may have noticed an unfamiliar word in



there - wormery. This is a system of composting that uses a large population of small earthworms to eat fruit and veg waste and convert it into high quality compost.

Using a wormery can be very rewarding for schools - it helps to manage their waste far better than a typical compost bin, makes great compost, and introduces teachers and pupils to a living ecosystem that can be enjoyed, studied, and learned from. Wormeries can be an excellent composting option for households and small businesses too. They are not suitable for processing garden waste or meat/fish waste, but they are very suited to most fruit and vegetable materials.

Hopefully the Composting in Schools scheme will be a great success in Cork. Making compost, improving soil health, growing some of our own food and supporting local biodiversity are all vital, yet enjoyable, components in sustaining our environment.

I would like to thank Donal O'Leary for sharing his knowledge about Composting in Schools with us and wish him success with all his future work in this vital area.



#### MACROOM SCHOOLS' HISTORY EXHIBITION, CASTLE HOTEL, 22ND MAY 2023

MACROOM HISTORY GROUP held its inaugural Annual Macroom Schools' History Exhibition on Monday, 22 May in the Castle Hotel, 7.00 - 10.00 p.m. Beforehand, students were busy preparing their stands and determined to show their work to best advantages. Teachers guided their charges and as people came, the excitement mounted. Some minor glitches added to the tension.

Youthreach Macroom showed a film, did an oral presentation and had a display. De La Salle and St Mary's students exhibited, a là 'The Young Scientist of The Year' format; each student or group had a stand, explained their projects and the reason(s) they picked that topic, and outlined what was involved in researching and producing their work. Family connections and proximity were strong strands running through many. Some students/ group gave short oral summaries of their work and took questions from the floor.

The film was on the Gearagh and the projects were on Kilmichael Ambush, Codrum House, Carrigadrohid Castle, Carrigaphooka Castle, Michael Collins, Mollie Cunningham, Kilcorney Ambush and more. The depth of work was very impressive, and the quality of the presentations was excellent. One could but marvel at the very:

high standard of the students' work.

Macroom Youthreach's Gearagh film featured relatives and descendants of people who had lived there before the 1950s flooding interviewed. (The Lee was dammed and the Gearagh flooded to provide water-power for the hydro-electric stations in Carrigadrohid and Inniscarra). Women recounted their forebears' stories, with a focus on what life was like for women, which without running water and electricity, was often drudgery. Counteracting this was an acceptance of life as it was, a vibrant community spirit and the great and simple social life enjoyed through scoraíochting, card-playing, etc. The Gearagh had a shop, owned by the Tobins, and it was the focal point of the area. The film was shot beautifully, and the interviewers and interviewees performed very well.



# MEP KELLEHER WELCOMES GOVERNMENT SUPPORT FOR REALISTIC NATURE RESTORATION LAW

### EUROPEAN PARLIAMENT'S CURRENT POSITION IS UNTENABLE FROM AN IRISH POV

Fianna Fáil MEP Billy Kelleher has welcomed the confirmation from two Government Ministers that they are seeking to amend the Nature Restoration Law to lessen the impact on Irish agriculture.

The Ireland South MEP was speaking following interventions from Agriculture Minister Charlie McConalogue on RTÉ's This Week, and from Minister of State, Malcolm Noonan on Newstalk's Pat Kenny Show this morning.

"It's clear that the Government understands that the Commission's original proposal goes just too far for Ireland. As such, Parliament's current position is even more problematic for Ireland.

"In an analysis my office has carried out into the three current proposals: Council, Commission and Parliament, the Bord na Móna rewetting numbers would only cover Ireland's overall commitments under the 2030 and 2040 Council and Commission versions. Under the Parliament's position, additional private agricultural land would need to be re-

"By 2030, the European Parliament, compared to the original proposal, wants Ireland to double the amount of land rewetted from 24,998 ha to 49,890 h. By 2050, the gap is even wider with Ireland needing to re-wet 153,800 ha. under the Parliament's text compared to 83,225 ha under the European Council's position.

"What is abundantly clear is that the European Parliament's current text is too onerous on Ireland. As an MEP, I will do my best to bring it closer to the Council's position as that is what the Government thinks is achievable and management from an Irish perspective. However, this may not be possible.

"Additionally, while much of the debate in Ireland has centred about peatland rewetting, I am concerned that more discussion has not taken place on how other elements of the NRL could impact on housing in Ireland.

"The proposals regarding no net-loss of green space in urban areas might seem harmless but the definition of green space as it stands could mean a limitation on our

ability to build on certain types of land in our towns and cities.

"We can restore our habitats in a meaningful way but we need to do it in conjunction with farmers and communities. We are talking about their livelihoods and that needs to be understood by decision makers in Brussels," concluded Kelleher.

# **Aghinagh Macra**



# Why Do I Wake Up With Neck Pain?

Sometimes described as a "crick" or "kink" in the neck, pain on waking in the morning is a common complaint from patients that come into our office.

The result is not only pain but an overall decrease in the range of motion of the neck. So, how does this happen?

will cause the neck to either be pushed forward or to the side too much where it is not aligned with the rest of the spine resulting in misalignment, muscle pulling and pain.

To have a "crick" or a "kink" is a term used when the bones, (vertebrae) in the neck are severely misaligned and putting pressure on the nerves leading to pain and decreased motion. Some people like to refer to this as a "pinched nerve". The misalignment of the neck will also cause muscle pulling over a period of time that can lead to spasm and inflammation resulting in pain.

How does the "kink" get fixed? As chiropractors we help to treat the problem in the neck with an adjustment. This will allow the bones to be restored to their normal position in the neck which results in reduced nerve pressure. After an adjustment, range of motion

and pain will be improved but inflammation is still taking place. The use of ice for periods of 15-20 minutes at a time will help with decreasing swelling and pain between adjustments.



Most people don't want to think about it, leaving it up to 'que-sera-sera' – what will be will be. But when something happens that's a horrific place to be without God and His Salvation (Romans 10:9-17; Ephesians 2:12). Some trust in their birth religion 'hoping' that because they fulfilled all the regulations, that rituals or beseeching saints will carry them safely on. Others proclaim that they don't believe in anything - that when you're gone - that's it; there's no more. How wrong they are, and how tragic when they find out the truth.
